## MANOR ROLLS OF HEXHAM, CO. NORTHUMBERLAND.

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The following rough notes will be found useful by anyone having occasion to search these rolls, as showing what are still extant, and their general arrangement.

Elizth," contains rolls for 38 Ed. 3 (two membranes, almost illegible from galls—mostly lists of actions); 43 Ed. 3 (two skins, in bad condition); 44 Ed. 3 (one membrane, nearly illegible); 24 Hen. 7—1 Hen. 8 (Forest Courts); 12 and 13 Hen. 8; 13 and 14 Hen. 8 (actions and suits); 17 and 18 Hen. 8 (the like); Rent Roll, not dated (endorsed, "About *temp.* Hen. 7 or 8," but query *temp.* Ric. 3); a fragment of a Forest Roll *temp.* Hen. 7 or earlier (lists of names, almost illegible); four fragments *temp.* Henry 8; 4 Eliz. (on paper); 5 Eliz.; 19 Eliz.; 1574 (on paper); 1615, 1638, 1650, 1679-81, 1687, 1689, 1690, 1694, 1695.

1775. Sept. 21. Nicholas Shield, of Broadwoodhall, yeoman, deceased, did at a Court held 18 April, 1749, surrender a messuage at Broadwoodhall and ground called the Snabb, and a fulling mill there, to the use of John Ridley, formerly of West side, and late of Wagerhouse, in East Allendale, deceased, to secure £100. The said John Ridley is since dead, leaving Thomas Currey, of Newcastle, mason, only son and heir of Humphrey Currey, deceased, who was eldest son and heir of Humphrey Currey, late of Redpath, par. Haltwhistle, deceased, by Mary, his wife, also deceased, one of the sisters of the full blood of John Ridley, father of said John Ridley, formerly of West Side, and late of Wagerhouse, deceased, and Mary Armstrong, of Glenwhelt, widow, and Ann, wife of Edward Dawson, of Haltwhistle, who are daughters and co-heirs of John Stephenson, late of Haltwhistle, deceased, who was son and heir of Christ. Stephenson, deceased, by Eleanor, his wife, also deceased, the other sister of the full blood of said John Ridley, father of said John Ridley, formerly of West Side, and late of Wagerhouse, deceased, which said Thos. Currey, Mary Armstrong, and Ann Dawson are next heirs of the said last named John Ridley, and are of full age, and they are admitted accordingly.
